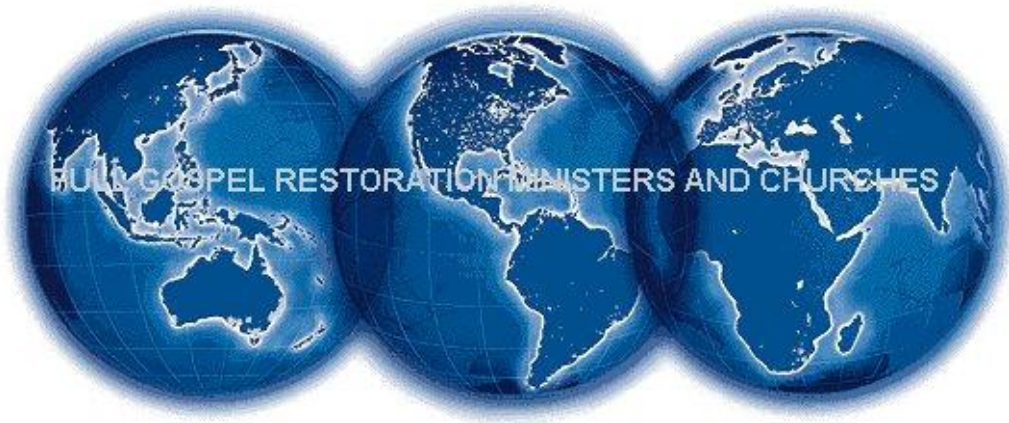

HISTORY AND PROGRAMS

Full Gospel Restoration Bible College is the educational arm of Full Gospel Restoration Ministers and Churches, World Wide Ministries, Ark Outreach Fellowship, and Word of Life Church/John 10:10 Ministries. **FGRBC extends an open arm of collaborating to all Evangelical / Pentecostal / Charismatic groups, and churches that would like their members to have a solid foundation for fulfilling the five-fold ministry.** Founded in 1987, FGRBC initially offered individual study courses, the completion of which earned individual certificates of completion. Over the years, FGRBC has expanded. Re-birthed in 2001, we offer a non secular college-level program of studies leading to a:

Diploma for Biblical Studies or Ministry

(a one-year specialty program)

Associate of Theology Degree or Associate of Ministry Degree.

Bachelor of Theology Degree or Bachelor of Ministry Degree.

Master of Pastoral Theology

Master of Theology Degree or Master of Ministry Degree.

Doctor of Theology Degree or Doctor of Ministry Degree

with a major in the following areas: Ministry, Christian Counseling, Worship Ministry, Missions & Evangelism, Prophetic Ministry, Youth Ministry, Theology, Biblical Studies, Divine Healing, and Christian Leadership. (In order to declare a major other than Theology, the student must complete 40 % or more of his/her courses in that area of specialty.) If there are NOT enough courses in a given major to meet 40%, the student may select a book not in the catalog and present it to the College Administration to be included in the Curriculum. (If the student is given permission to help in developing the course, extra credit will be given.)

ADMISSION POLICY

Full Gospel Restoration Bible College is accredited with Accrediting Commission International, Beebe, AR. Our PRIMARY accreditation comes from the Word of God to teach and make disciples. Admission is open to all who desire to go forth and minister the gospel of Jesus Christ. **Full Gospel Restoration Bible College is not accredited through the U.S. Department of Education.** This permits us to accept students who may not have a GED or High School Diploma; however, they must be capable of reading and understanding our curriculum.



TUITION AND FEES

Because Full Gospel Restoration Bible College has a single purpose and goal, the tuition and fees are designed to cover expenses and the development of new courses that are relevant, comprehensive, Biblically-based, Christ-centered, and Spirit-filled. Our Bible college education is available to all who desire to minister. We do ask in return for the privilege of a low-cost education that the student makes a commitment before the Lord. That commitment is to take what he or she has learned at FGRBC and use it to the glory of God to spread the Good News about Jesus around the earth, to all people, so that all might have a chance to be saved before He returns.

Tuition Refund Policy... because our college is set up to start upon registration, students will have 15 days to withdraw. After the 15 day from registration the student is 100% responsible for the present school year tuition, whether the student pays in full or accepts the one year tuition payment plan. All tuition is in accordance with the tuition fees as established on our current web page. The Registration Fee is **NON REFUNDABLE**. The tuition is subject to change without notice. Any fully-prepaid tuition for any degree program locks in the tuition fee at that present tuition. If the student is making payments and **does not** complete in one year +4 months, the increase in the following year will be applicable.

FOR THE REST OF 2009, ALL COURSES MAY BE TAKEN BY THE SPOUSE OF A FULL-TIME STUDENT FOR **FREE** (ONE FOR ONE). THE ONLY ADDED COSTS ARE FOR BOOKS, CD’S, REGISTRATION FEE (\$25), AND CERTIFICATE FEE (\$15).

(This is a trial program and may be withdrawn at any time. All those who have signed up will be honored as long as their tuition and progress is continual, even if the program is eliminated.)

EXAMINATIONS

The primary textbook at Full Gospel Restoration Bible College is the Bible. Supplementary reading is assigned which is designed to illuminate the Word of God as the source of all our knowledge and model for action and ministry. To this end--the thorough understanding of the Word of God and its application for our lives and

ministries--examinations or projects are given at the end of each course. Earlier Courses will have a **written** Exam at the End of the Workbook. (true/false, multiple choice, completion, and essay), and all courses will require an **expository** summary on each chapter of the book. Additionally, a student will be required to consider the Biblical accuracy of each Chapter. The purpose of the examination process is to insure that not only has the student read and understood the assigned material, but that he or she has also internalized and appropriated the course matter for use in his or her own life and ministry. All exams are open book, and there is no time limit for taking any final exam. **If you are doing an expository portion, DO NOT copy directly out of the book. You will be exactly right and will still fail.** The expository exams are set up to evaluate your grasp of the material. The grading scale for the expository portion is (75%) C, (85%) B, or (95%) A. The score is based on what other students submitted for the same test. Writing over 250 words for the summary portion of the chapter in the undergraduate courses will NOT give you a better grade.

ALL workbooks are set up so they can be saved to your hard drive. You may insert your answers, and we encourage you to save your work after each session. When a workbook is complete, SAVE it, and EMAIL it as an ATTACHMENT. This will allow us to open and grade your work with no added cost for postage and shipment handling. If you are using MICROSOFT WORKS, please request an RTF Workbook.

GRADES

Full Gospel Restoration Bible College indicates a student's standing in a completed course by a letter grade. The majority of FGRBC courses are three (3) credit hours courses. The scale of grades, plus the honor point equivalent for each letter grade, is as follows:

A minimum grade of C- is required to be credited with the completion of an undergraduate course toward an undergraduate degree, or the Certificate of Ministry or Certificate of Biblical Studies. A minimum grade average of B- is required to be credited with the completion of a course toward the graduate degree of master's in any specialized area of study. Students who do not achieve the required minimum grade will be expected to wait thirty days before re-testing.

Transcripts of a student's academic record at FGRBC are kept by the College Registrar. One set of transcripts will be sent free-of-charge directly to the student, or to whomever the student directs, at any time the student chooses. A fee of \$15 will be charged to send another set. Academic records are not available to anyone other than the student without the student's permission.

TRANSFER OF CREDIT

The program of study at Full Gospel Restoration Bible College is designed to fit together as an integral whole with the purpose of moving the student along a path to a desired goal of completeness as a minister of the Gospel. Transfer of credit from another institution of higher learning will only be granted when the course to be transferred is substantially identical to the FGRBC course for which substitution is desired. In no case will transfer credits be accepted which total more than one-half of the credits needed for a degree at FGRBC.

Example: World Wide Ministries School of Ministry Internship program would be accepted as the first year equivalent in FGRBC. Students continuing their Biblical studies would be accepted into the college as second year students.

LIFE EXPERIENCE CREDIT

Full Gospel Restoration Bible College is a bon-a-fide Bible College. Substitution of life ministerial experience "credit" will be evaluated on an individual basis. Up to 20% will be consider for transfer based upon the length of time in 100% full time ministry.

THE DIPLOMA FOR MINISTERS PROGRAM AND THE BIBLICAL STUDY PROGRAM

If you have chosen to be a minister with FULL GOSPEL RESTORATION MINISTERS AND CHURCHES, you are required to equip yourself for ministry by following a prescribed discipline of study.

There are certain courses required by each group to fulfill its requirements for ministry. Before selecting a course of study, you should apply with an organization to be sure you meet its requirements for a ministerial license. As a member of a group, you should start planting a seed faith offering of a "tithe of a tithe" (1%) along with an "accomplishment report" each month stating how you are growing and how God is using you. You should also start to read the Bible through within the first year. All of these are disciplines that you must acquire in order to survive in the ministry.

The program of studies leading to the one-year Diploma of Ministry or Biblical Studies is designed to equip the student to function as an effective, competent pastor/ assistant pastor, Christian worker, or evangelist. Basic skills and knowledge will be acquired in areas fundamental to the practice of Christian ministry. The Diploma of Ministry is required as a minimum for most ministerial groups involved with Full Gospel Restoration Bible College. A church or group may require its students to attend a special training class. These special classes (usually once a month) are not required by FGRBC but are encouraged for the practical teaching not found in books that can only come from seasoned ministers who have experience in areas in which they are teaching. Because FGRBC believes in the involvement of the local church, students attending seminars in those churches affiliated with FGRBC will be given a maximum 1 credit per month for the monthly classes attended not to exceed 9 credit hours per year. In order to receive the 9 credits, the time spent in class must total twelve hours or more for the year. Colossians 1:10 That ye might walk worthy of the Lord unto all pleasing, being fruitful in every good work, and increasing in the knowledge of God.

THE ASSOCIATE’S DEGREE PROGRAM

The additional year of study leading to the degree of Associate of Theology or Associate of Ministry is designed to broaden the experience and deepen the knowledge of the holder of the Certificate of Ministry or Biblical Studies. The student may elect to receive a degree in Theology or Ministry based upon the the needs of the ministry in which he or she is or will be engaged. He or she can function as a mature pastor/teacher, Christian worker, evangelist, or counselor of even greater service to our Lord Jesus Christ. 24 credits are required per year in the required track. Another 6 credits for each year will be awarded for reading the Bible through in independent studies. The two requirements constitutes the 60 credits required for an Associate Degree of Theology or an Associate Degree of Ministry..

THE BACHELOR’S DEGREE PROGRAM

The Bachelor’s Degree Program is a four-year program to thoroughly equip the minister / evangelist / counselor / pastor in every facet of ministry. The person that holds the bachelor’s degree will have majored in a specific area of study. Those areas are: Theology, Ministry, Christian Counseling, Worship Ministry, Missions & Evangelism, Prophetic Ministry, Youth Ministry, Biblical Studies, Divine Healing, Intercession, and Christian Leadership. 24 credits are required per year in the required track. Another 6 credits for each year will be awarded for reading the Bible through in independent studies. The two requirements constitutes the 120 credits required for an Bachelor Degree of Theology or an Bachelor Degree of Ministry. (This includes the 60 credits for the Associate Degree)

For any degree other than theology, 40% of the courses taken must be in the area of the declared major.

THE MASTER'S DEGREE PROGRAM
FOR PASTORAL THEOLOGY

The Master's Program for Pastoral Theology is for the individual who has completed a minimum of ten years in the Pastoral Role either as a senior pastor or an associate pastor in a church. The individual who completes this level is not only qualified to defend the Gospel, but also to publish books and teach others with accuracy and confidence. This degree requires 40 credits of work beyond his or her 10+ years experience in pastoral ministry and is offered for those who desire specialized, advanced certification in a specific area. Since the student is at a point of developing mastery in his or her life, one demonstration of this mastery will be the student's involvement in working in conjunction with his advisor in selecting the structure and course for his degree. (No other degree prerequisite is required because of the pastor's proven experience in his/her field.) The 40-credit master's degrees generally include:

- Approximately 27 credits which are the compilation of sermons, papers, tapes, course development, or discoveries in the areas the pastor has specialized in during 10+ years of service. i.e., church administration, counseling, theology, youth ministry, senior development, jail and hospital ministries, or a combination, etc.
- A Master's thesis - see thesis requirements. This thesis may be published on the Bible College web pages for other ministers to read, learn, and excel from your experiences. [Psalms 34:11 LITV](#) *My sons, come, listen to Me; I will make known to you the fear of Jehovah.*
- In preparing your thesis, you must share your experiences as a pastor. The way you handle difficult situations, and the way you later might have wished you had handled the situation, may be one of the areas of consideration. Share your victories, failures, and your discoveries. It is our desire, that with a multitude of pastors participating in this, new pastors may learn from our experience and have a less bumpy journey.
- Compiling the 27 credits will be done by you and your advisor to meet the Bible College's standard of excellence. The credits will consist of past development of sermons, lessons, and discoveries that you have incorporated into your ministry. It may include book reports on certain topics that had a profound effect on your ministry. Some examples are as follows:

1. Book reports on a Counseling Ministry within the church using such books as:
 - a. *Counseling* By: John MacArthur
 - b. *Effective Biblical Counseling* By: Larry Crabb(If your Pastoral Master is based on books that built your ministry, then there should be a minimum of 5 book reports.)
2. A compilation of sermon series that built a church on a Biblical structure.
 - i.e. A Team Effective Church with a Team Vision.

- i.e. An urban church structure reaching the street gangs, addicts, and homosexuals.
- i.e. A deliverance church based on setting people free as a new creation in Christ.
- i.e. A rural church developing the farmers and ranchers for the Kingdom Planting.

NO MATTER WHAT METHOD IS USED, EVERYTHING MUST BE BASED AND BACKED UP BY SCRIPTURE. In other words don't tell us what some philosopher thought on a given area unless it can also be backed up by the Holy Bible.

- Approximately 10 credits of practica are awarded for his/her service in the pastoral role.
- The total cost for the Master of Pastoral Theology is \$777. Payment programs of one or two years with 10% down are available.
 - 1 year \$777 - \$77 down payment - 10 payments of \$65 and a final payment of \$50. No Degree will awarded until all work and fees are submitted.
 - 2 years \$777 - \$77 down payment - 22 payments of \$31 and a final payment of \$18. No Degree will awarded until all work and fees are submitted.
 - If you pay in full at the time of registration for the Masters of Pastoral Theology you will receive a cash discount, making your cost only \$700.

Master's Thesis Preparation

This is to be a minimum of 50 typed double-spaced pages (maximum 12-point font) in which you thoroughly discuss each of the following:

1. The **ministry area** God has asked me to prepare for is...
2. The **vision God has given me** concerning this area of ministry is...
3. **Revelatory insights from Scripture** concerning this area are...
4. **Revelatory insights from life** concerning this area are...
5. **Revelatory insights from journaling** concerning this area are...
6. **Revelatory insights from my counselors** (e.g., books and those I seek out as spiritual advisors) concerning this area are...
7. A summary of the above, and the **next steps** God has told me to take are...
8. A bibliography should be attached with at least 50 sources for your Thesis.

Your answers to numbers 3-6 above do not need to be listed separately but can be merged together in your writing.

ADVISORY To be considered for the Pastoral Theology Master's Degree Program. A Pastor must be currently serving a congregation with a good report. He or she must have served at least 4 years in two churches to be accepted (Example: 4 yrs in 2 previous churches and 2 years in the present one would qualify). All references will be checked and prayed over before acceptance to the program is granted. If you are accepted and a serious character flaw is revealed, we will ask you to address that area and to place safeguards against it, prior to awarding the degree. Should your application be declined, you will given the reason(s) why and will have 30 days from posting to appeal the decision. After 30 days, the decision will be finalized and the applicant will not be allow to apply again for one year.

THE MASTER'S DEGREE PROGRAM

The Master's Program is for the individual who has completed a bachelor's degree with a B- or better and desires to become an expert in a specific area of ministry. The individual who completes this level is not only qualified to defend the Gospel, but also to publish books and teach others with accuracy and confidence. These degrees require 40 credits of work beyond the bachelor's level and are offered for those who desire specialized, advanced training in a specific area. Since the student is at a point of developing mastery in his life, one demonstration of this mastery will be the student's involvement in working in conjunction with his advisor in selecting the courses for his degree.

The 40-credit Master's Degrees generally include:

- Approximately 27 credits of courses.
- A Master's thesis (3 credits).
- Approximately 10 credits of practica.

The student has the option of developing specialized courses with his faculty advisor (or dean) in the areas of his choosing, or of taking any of the vast array of more than 80 undergraduate courses with a difficulty level of 2 or greater. To take an undergraduate course at the graduate level, you will begin with the course syllabus for the undergraduate course. This will lay out a foundational program in the area of your interest and will require two or three resources for your meditation. You will complete this and add further research, study and meditation, choosing one of the suggestions below. A three-credit course would still be worth three credits. There are several possible avenues you may pursue, including but not limited to the following:

1. You may read other books on the topic and write a report on them. This report should include:
 - a. A summary of the truths, principles and concepts taught in the book,
 - b. A record of what the Lord has said to you specifically through the book, and
 - c. Any ways in which your life has been changed as a result of your meditation on this book.
2. You may do a Biblical research project on a topic related to any of the course objectives. (Refer to BIB390 Biblical Dissertation for instructions on how to do such a project.)
3. You may do a research project based on other than Biblical sources on a topic related to any of the course objectives.
4. You may prepare an *original* sermon, Bible study, study guide, or other instructional format to present what you have learned.
5. You may teach the 12-week course to a group after you have completed it. If you choose this option, you will receive one extra credit free of charge. Teaching a 5-8 hour weekend seminar on the topic will also fulfill the graduate-level requirement, but you will not receive an extra credit.

THE DOCTORAL DEGREE PROGRAM

The doctoral program for program for Theology or Ministry has the same requirements as the master degree with an added 8 courses and a dissertation of 120-170 pages with at least 25-75 references. The dissertation outline must be submitted and approved before developing.

SPECIALTY PROGRAMS

DIPLOMA PROGRAMS FOR PERSONAL ENHANCEMENT

Many students desire to study in a certain area but do not desire to go through a degree program. That student may sign up for a special Diploma in Ministry with specialty in any of the following: Ministry, Christian Counseling, Worship Ministry, Missions & Evangelism, Prophetic Ministry, Youth Ministry, Theology, Biblical Studies, Divine Healing, Intercession, and Christian Leadership. The Diploma program requires 30 credits from the Bachelor's Degree Program. 6 credits may be from reading the New Testament and taking the New Testament Comprehension Exam. You must take 40% of your courses in your specialized area. If there is a textbook (must have at least 120 pages) that is in your area that you would like to make a part of your diploma program, you must submit it for approval. If approved, you must write at least one page on each chapter that summarizes the chapter with any insights the Holy Spirit revealed to you in the reading of the chapter. All chapters must be turned in together. **DO NOT SEND INDIVIDUAL CHAPTERS FOR GRADING.**

INTERNATIONAL DEGREE PROGRAM

The International Degree Program is set up to provide a four year degree to those who would rather use the Holy Bible as their only study book. (This program was set up for ministers in underdeveloped countries where books are not available). The first-year books are Matthew - Revelation, and Genesis – Deuteronomy. The exams consist of multiple-choice questions. The second year covers Joshua – Malachi with the exams in multiple-choice format. The third year books are Matthew - Revelation, and Genesis – Deuteronomy with an expository final using the outlines provided. The student will do the exposition as it applies to him or her, his or her ministry and country. The fourth year focuses on Joshua – Malachi with an expository exam using the outlines provided. The student will do the exposition as it applies to him, his ministry, and country. **EACH YEAR**, the student will be expected to read through the Bible completely. At the completion of the second year, he/she will receive an Associate of Theology Degree and upon completion of the fourth year a Bachelor's Degree in Theology. This course may be set up to teach in the local church with the pastor or his designee supplementing as he/she is led.

At the end of the Bachelor of Theology Program the student will have read the Bible **FOUR** times with an in-depth study using multiple-choice questions and an in-depth study using an expository approach with personal and national application.

He offers the theological background for spiritual warfare and deliverance, and also offers valid, biblical and practical advice for those engaging in a deliverance ministry. Particularly noteworthy is his discussion of the possible connection between demonization and various mental health issues like multiple personality disorder (he does not believe all mental health issues are the result of demonization).

This may be the only introductory book on spiritual warfare you need. Its comprehensive nature and thorough analysis of pertinent biblical passages and real-life experiences make this book indispensable for the war that Christians can find themselves in. Ultimately, Murphy wants to offer those who are afflicted by demons, both inside and outside the church, the freedom that is available in Christ, and this book goes a long way in helping people find that freedom.

THE DOCTORAL DEGREE PROGRAM

The doctoral program for program for Theology or Ministry has the same requirements the master's with an added 8 courses and a dissertation of 120-170 pages with at least 25-75 references. The dissertation outline must be submitted and approved before proceeding.

GENERAL BIBLE

GB 101P—Basic Bible Doctrine

OT 207P—Book of Esther

OT 213P—Christ in the Tabernacle

OT 315P—Proverbs

"Proverbs are short sentences drawn from long experience." This is one of the many profound insights J.Vernon McGee offers in his commentary on the book of Proverbs. During this study you will gain the tools of interpretation needed to dig out the spiritual treasures of God's wisdom found in Proverbs. The diligent student is given a promise from God to understand the fear of the Lord and find the knowledge of God.

OT 401P—Study of Daniel

And the Corinthian church had its share of problems, but God in His wisdom had the answer . . . just as He does for us today!

NT 221P—Revelation

NT 304P—I Peter

We can prepare for the best of God's blessings even if the world attempts to overwhelm us with fears and the worst of man's hatred.

NT 311P—Book of Hebrews

Schuyler English is quoted by J.Vernon McGee as saying, "The Epistle to the Hebrews, one of the most important books of the New Testament in that it contains some of the chief doctrines of the Christian faith, is, as well, a book of infinite logic and great beauty. To read it is to breathe the atmosphere of heaven itself. To study it is to partake of strong spiritual meat. To abide in its teachings is to be led from immaturity to maturity in the knowledge of Christian truth and of Christ Himself. It is to 'go on unto perfection'." We agree.


NT 312P—I, II & III John & Jude

Using the commentary by J.Vernon McGee as the study guide, these four epistles combine to deliver a very rewarding course. Ephesus at the beginning of the second century was much like your city or hometown today. There was familiarity with Christianity but the newness had worn off. The Ephesians had become "assembly-line" Christians filled with compromise. The definitions of God, that He is Love, Light, and Life draw the student into a deeper understanding of our Father in heaven. The epistle of Jude anchors this study with his call to awareness of the coming apostasy.

NT 316P—Colossians

In this course Dr. Charles Stanley shares the specifics of how to receive God's forgiveness, and addresses such issues as how to practice a life of forgiveness in terms of relationships and how to make forgiveness an ongoing, practical experience. Helping others deal with unforgiveness and bitterness is one of the most important tasks Christian counselors face today.

CC 311P-Counseling the Bereaved

"Ministering to the grief of those left behind following the death of a loved one is never an easy task. Our world is growing more complicated, the challenges are becoming greater, and the situations people face, more intense." This practical course uses insight from Warren and David Wiersbe to provide a comprehensive and scriptural resource for pastors and church leaders who counsel people who mourn. It shows how to comfort people through the grieving process and how to minister in a wide variety of situations to those who are dealing with death.

CC 312P—God's Strength for Life's Journey

What do you do with the bumps on the path of life? Climb on them. God doesn't remove the stones and straighten the path because the bumps are what you can climb on! If you are carrying emotional baggage, you'll need to set it down to climb. Else it will weigh you down with guilt, pain, and inner suffering. Emotional baggage becomes bondage. Wise leaders refuse to let crises crush them. They use obstacles for their advantage. Times of waiting can be agonizing for a leader. Joshua made the most of his transition time. He didn't squander the years muttering about missed opportunities. He seized the opportunities God granted him. Most importantly, he never neglected his own walk with God. Because of his faithfulness he retained his hope."

God used Joshua despite his past, his youth, and despite the sins of others. God used the transition times in Joshua's life. Joshua followed his convictions, even if he stood alone.

NEW TESTAMENT

NT 605-Philippians & Colossians

Vernon McGee discuss how Christ is preeminent in all things and how we can see Him as our life, our mind, our goal and our strength. Philippians deals with the philosophy, pattern, prize, and power for Christian living.
